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EORI number



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EORI NUMBER

The economic operator registration and identification number (EORI) is allocated by the customs authorities to the importer and exporter upon request.

This identification number to be required for customs clearance of your shipment.

EORI number is also mandatory for recipients and/or importers.

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HS/Taric codes



CUSTOMS TARIFF NUMBERS

At least eight-digit HS (Harmonized System) code is used to uniquely identify traded commodities.

It tells the customs authorities which goods your shipment contains and which import duties and taxes are applicable upon import.

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TSP – Transitional Simplified Procedure.

TSP NUMBER

The TSP number simplifies the import customs procedure (reducing the amount of information that British consignees are required to provide in the import custom declaration).

It is applicable to most goods (except dangerous goods).

A British recipients and/or importers have to register to get a TSP number.

TSP number must be included in imported shipments documents accompanying.

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Data for export / import

RELEVANT DATA

In addition to the EORI and HS code numbers, the customs authorities also require additional information which must be consistent with the electronic documentation of the shipment.

Please provide us with this information (ideally) upon pick-up of your shipment. Without this, same-day customs clearance is not possible.

- Senders and recipients address
- Senders and recipients Email and phone number
- Description of goods
- Value of goods
- HS code
- Country of origin
- EORI number of sender / recipient
- TSP – if available
- Senders and recipients VAT ID
- Incoterms

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Important documents



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ACCOMPANYING DOCUMENTS

For goods of commercial value, you must include with your shipment. For goods without commercial value a pro forma invoice is required.

Invoices must be in English.

- Include:
- The details of sender, recipient and goods
- One original invoice and four copies for each shipment
- Sender's signature (mandatory)
- Power of attorney (if customs clearance is mandatory)



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What next? What you need to know

31st OF JANUARY 2020: UNITED KINGDOM LEAVES THE EU

- Transitional phase until 31st of December 2020:
Goods and service transactions remain unchanged
- As of 1st January 2021: End of transitional phase, two possible outcomes:
 - Exit with free agreement
 - "No-deal-Brexit" without free trade agreement and with the following consequences:
 - prolonged lead times due to customs clearance
 - increased cost due to additional import- and export-processing
